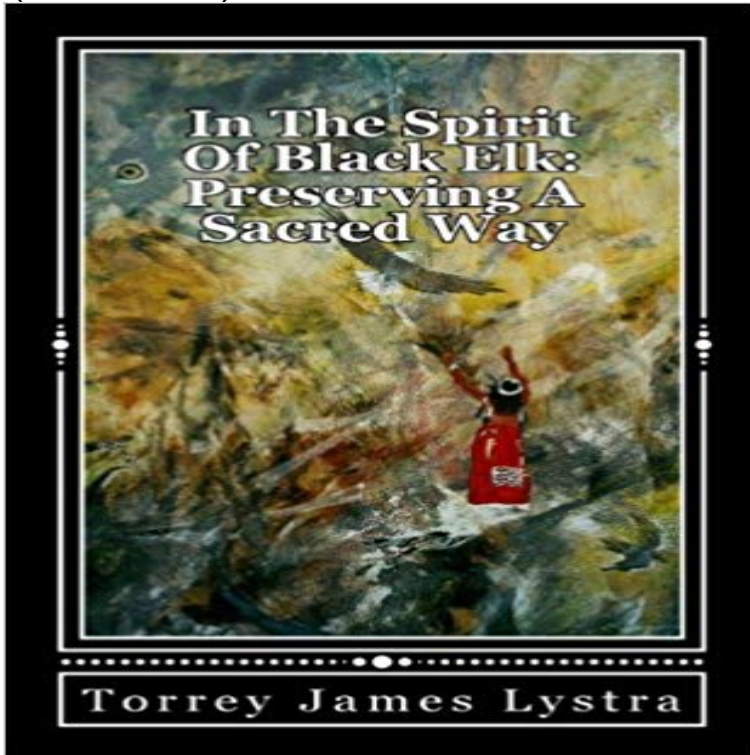


In The Spirit Of Black Elk: Preserving A Sacred Way (Sacred Earth) (Volume 1)
