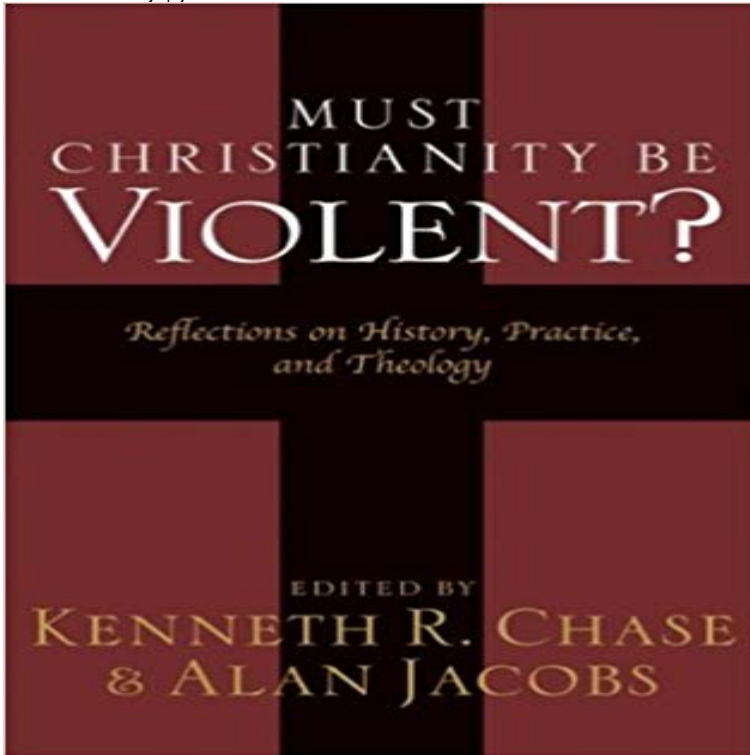


Must Christianity Be Violent?: Reflections on History, Practice, and Theology
