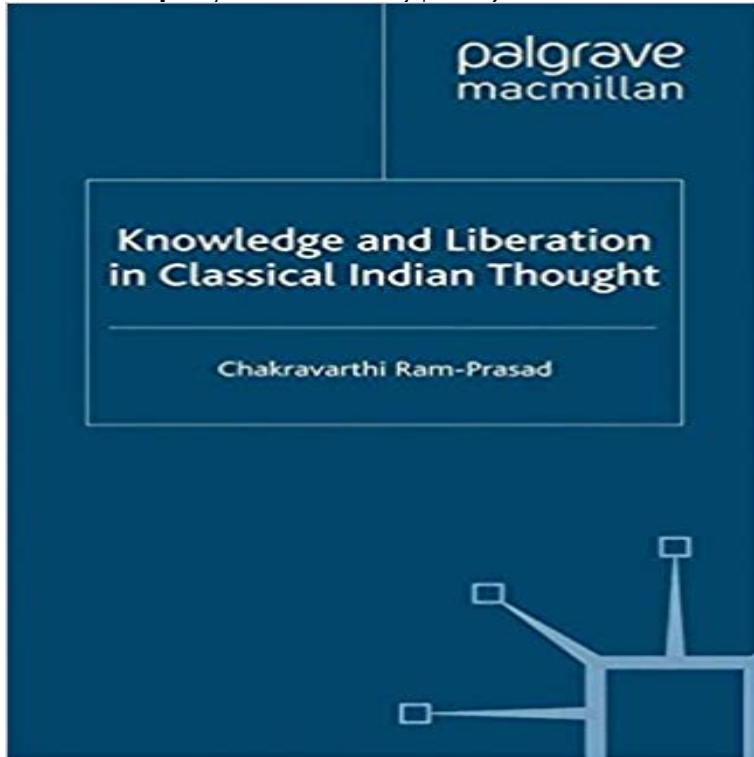


Knowledge and Liberation in Classical Indian Thou (Library of Philosophy and Religion)
